Orot Israel College**

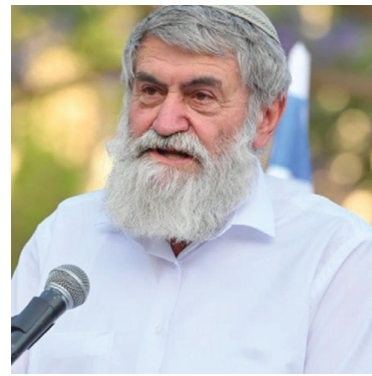

Innovation in Motion: A Campus Day with Alumot



Early in December, Orot Israel College hosted a special delegation from the "Alumot" program, an initiative dedicated to strengthening teacher training and promoting educational leadership in Israel.

The day opened with a meeting with the College President, Prof. Meir Hildesheimer, and the College CEO, Rabbi Chaim Fogel, who shared the College's vision for teaching and its significant contribution to the field of education.

The delegation then visited several classes across the campus:

- Communication class with Dr. Yehuda Vitalzon and Mr. Aharon Ben Hamo: Students demonstrated models of innovative and creative teaching.
- Dance and movement session: The internship team showcased experiential learning that integrates movement, creativity, and educational reflection.
- Mathematics class with Dr. Reut Parsha: Guests experienced hands-on teaching methods that encourage problem-solving, creativity, and deep thinking.

Over lunch, an open discussion with faculty highlighted the strong sense of teamwork, dedication to students, and the wide range of educational initiatives happening at the College.

The group continued with a campus tour, meeting additional staff and learning about the ROM Excellence Program from its head, Dr. Haim Alboim.

Dance Department at Orot College



Orot Israel College is Israel's first and only academic framework where observant women can train to teach dance in the spirit of Halacha, earning a B.Ed., senior teacher's certificate, and teaching license from K–12. Since 1998, the program has merged art and faith, fostering professional excellence and spiritual growth. Students explore performance, creativity, and self-discovery, and about 80% of graduates work in education or as independent choreographers.

Looking to the Future- Master's Degree in Dance Teaching (M.Ed.)

Launching Israel's first M.Ed. in dance teaching, this program will develop "expert teachers," integrate Neuropedagogy and neuroscience with movement, and strengthen arts education in the state-religious system. It prepares women to be innovative, self-sufficient educators who can navigate both professional and spiritual challenges.

Noga Dance Company

Founded in 2009, Noga Dance Company is Israel's first religious professional dance company, providing a platform for choreographers and dancers to unite spiritual values with artistic expression. The company performs for diverse women's audiences and has appeared at major venues and festivals nationwide, including the Suzanne Dellal Center, Karmiel Dance Festival, and Emuna Dance Festival.

Dr. Talia Perlstein, Head of Orot Israel's Dance Department

Dr. Talia Perlstein, founder and head of the Dance/Movement Program at Orot Israel College, is a leading educator and choreographer dedicated to advancing dance within the Religious-Zionist community. She established Orot's four-year academic track in dance, developing a strong professional pathway for religious women and shaping the identity of the department through high academic standards, creativity, and values-based pedagogy.

Beyond her academic leadership, Dr. Perlstein has broadened artistic opportunities through initiatives such as the Noga Dance Troupe and community collaborations that bring high-quality women's dance to schools and cultural events. Her research and educational work focus on dance as a space for personal growth, professional development, and the integration of faith and artistic expression.
